whether an alien has a medical condition affecting his or her eligibility for a visa or immigration benefit. The information requested is limited to the result of any diagnostic tests required for the diagnosis of diseases identified as communicable diseases of public health significance, as well as other evaluations identified as necessary to confirm a medical ineligibility under INA § 212(a)(1), 8 U.S.C. 1182(a)(1) or to comply with other requirements. Collecting this information is essential to protecting public health in the United States.

# Methodology

A panel physician, designated by the consular post, performs a medical examination of the applicant and completes the electronic form in the eMedical portal in accordance with instructions issued by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). The information collected is retained by the Bureau of Consular Affairs and available to the CDC and DHS.
