THE PAPERWORK REDUCTION ACT OF 1995 (Pub. L. 104-13) STATEMENT OF PUBLIC BURDEN: The purpose of this information collection is to allow ORR to assess a potential sponsor's ability to care for the mental, physical, and financial well-being of a UAC. Public reporting burden for this collection of information is estimated to average 10 to 11 hours per response, including the time for reviewing instructions, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and reviewing the collection of information. This is a mandatory collection of information (6 U.S.C. 279; 8 U.S.C. 1232; Flores v. Reno Settlement Agreement, No. CV85-4544-RJK (C.D. Cal. 1996)). An agency may not conduct or sponsor, and a person is not required to respond to, a collection of information subject to the requirements of the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995, unless it displays a currently valid OMB control number. ### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### Q: Can I sponsor a child if I am illegally present in the United States?

A: If you are illegally present in the United States, you may be eligible to sponsor a minor, pending assessment of your overall fitness to serve as a sponsor. It is important to remember, however, that service as a sponsor in no way confers any legal status or benefit upon you or any illegally present member of your family, and that you can still be removed from the United States at any time.

#### Q: Is there a cost to sponsor a child?

A: There is no fee to complete the Sponsor Verification Application. However, you will be responsible for costs associated with the child's travel and escort upon release and you will also be required to demonstrate adequate financial and other resources to cover any and all costs necessary for appropriate care of a child. Your inability to demonstrate that you have adequate financial and other resources to care for a child (or, where applicable, more than one child) will be a factor in potential placement in consideration of other factors. For non-parents, ORR may require further evidence of your ability to financially support a child.

#### Q: Do I need an attorney to sponsor a child?

A: You do not need an attorney to complete this application or to sponsor a child, although you do have the ability to obtain an attorney to assist you with the application and/or the sponsorship process.

#### Q: Why do I have to submit my fingerprints?

A: The Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) requires background checks, which may necessitate the taking of potential sponsors' fingerprints in order to verify the potential sponsors' identities and assure child health and safety. Your Case Manager will assist you to schedule an appointment to have your fingerprints taken. Please contact your Case Manager for additional information about the fingerprint collection process.

#### Q: What information do I have to provide?

A: You must complete the entire Sponsor Verification Application and provide all requested supporting documentation in order to be considered to be a sponsor. You must also answer any and all questions truthfully, including follow-up questions, from your Case Manager. Your inability to complete any part of the Sponsor Verification Application, or provide any of the requested supporting documentation, may result in a denial of your application.

### Q: When do I need to give these documents to my Case Manager?

A: You will need to submit all required information, including documentation, no later than 45 calendar days after a request by your Case Manager. After 60 days have passed, failure to provide information within the allotted time frame may result in a denial of your application. The sooner you submit all required documentation and information, the sooner ORR can make a decision on whether to release the child to your care. ORR will inform you promptly of its decision, or will request additional information as needed.

#### Q: Am I required to submit a DNA test to prove that I'm biologically related to the child?

A: Generally, sponsors may voluntarily submit to a DNA test to prove they are biologically related to the child in support of this application. DNA results can be used to prove a biological relationship exists in lieu of supporting paperwork (such as birth certificates) or where such paperwork is difficult or impossible to obtain and/or authenticate in a timely manner. ORR will pay for the cost of the DNA test. In some instances where ORR has serious concerns about fraud regarding the biological relationship of the child and the proposed sponsor or other individual in the sponsor's household, the agency may require an ORR-paid DNA test, before making a release decision.

### **Oathor Affirmation**

I certify, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America, that the information contained in this Sponsor Verification Application and the evidence submitted with it were provided or authorized by me, that I reviewed and understand all the information is complete, true and correct. Title 18, United States Code, 1001, provides in part that whoever knowingly and willfully: falsifies, conceals, or covers up by any trick, scheme, or device a material fact; makes any materially false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation; or makes or uses any false writing or document knowing the same to contain any materially false, factitious, or fraudulent statement or entry; shall be fined in accordance with this title or imprisonment for up to 8 years, or both.

I further swear or affirm that I played no role whatsoever in any effort to transport the child or children who I am seeking to sponsor via this Sponsor Verification Application to the United States. This means, among other things, that I declare and affirm that I played no role, monetary or otherwise, in procuring or initiating the transportation of the child or children to the United States, and have no knowledge of others who might have played a role, monetary or otherwise, in procuring or initiating the transportation of the child or children to the United States. I understand that any awareness on my part of such efforts, any involvement in such efforts, or any provision of false information about such efforts could subject me to Federal civil and/or criminal penalties.

I further swear or affirm that I am aware of the major medical and health needs of the child or children who I am seeking to sponsor via this Sponsor Verification Application. In the case of any female child who I am seeking to sponsor, I further attest that I am aware either that she is pregnant or may be pregnant, and that, in the event of a current or future pregnancy, I am solely responsible for that child's prenatal care.

I further attest or affirm that I will abide by the care instructions contained in the Sponsor Care Agreement, and that I understand that failure to abide by the care instructions required by the Sponsor Care Agreement may result in removal of a child or children from my care and/or Federal civil and/or criminal penalties.

If urther attest that I understand that I must comply with all Federal, State, and local laws, including regulations and ordinances, governing the care of any child or children in my custody as a sponsor, which includes:

- Enrolling the child or children in school.
- Providing the child or children with medical care as needed.
- Protecting the child or children from abuse, neglect, and abandonment, including from other members of my household or individuals with whom I share a residence.
- Ensuring the minor(s) attendance at all immigration-related proceedings;
- Notifying ORR or other appropriate Federal government personnel at least 30 days in advance of any intentto depart the residence that I have listed as my current residence on this Sponsor Verification Application.

By signing this Sponsor Verification Application and submitting evidence with it, I certify that I am able to read and enter or submit the information in the English language or I received the assistance of an interpreter or a preparer fluent in the English language and a language I can understand to read and enter or submit the information on my behalf.
